I recently left Haiti and will more likely be back in Benin when you receive this newsletter. I really appreciate how many of you reached out to Haiti with either funds or supplies to minister and meet needs that existed. Thanks so much for rallying behind us.





On February 23rd, a small team of 3 persons (Gideon's Army) accompanied to Haiti. We flew into the Dominican Republic and drove about 8 hours by road to enter Haiti.

A construction engineer (Joe Marchese) was among the team and was able to access the damages to the CCWM compound and some other missions and sites. At present we have estimated over \$12,000 worth of damage to the buildings. With what many of you have already provided, I have been able to begin repairs to the exterior walls and some structural and foundational damages.

I praise God for that and I'm believing Him to provide all that will eventually be needed to repair all damages!

Church of Philadelphia which sent 24 barrels of food, water and clothing, the team was able to do outreach by going to two Refugee/Tent camps to deliver care packages and to minister Christ. It was a glorious day! Many new converts accompanied us on the outreach and experienced the joy of sharing Christ with others for the first time.
